Daily Activity:

1. Number facts – ordering numbers 1-20, counting forwards and backwards to 20, number bonds to 5, number bonds to 10 and doubling numbers 1-5.
2. PopMaths for five to ten minutes.
3. Spellings – practise writing tricky words (I, no, go, to, the, into) from memory.
4. Phonics activity – use your phonics flash cards to practise the sounds and make words with them.
5. Reading – share your library books for pleasure and practise your reading using your school reading book.

Pick 'n' Mix: These are additional to the daily activities which enable children to practice and embed key skills. No additional learning opportunities will be set until after the Easter Holiday, if necessary.

In one minute how many times can you: hop on one leg, do star jumps, stand up and sit down. What can you think of to do in one minute?	Practise cutting using a knife and fork. Practise spooning water from one bowl to another bowl.	Play a game that involves taking turns and sharing for example board games, card game, eye-spy, pairs and lotto. We have put 'Snakes and Ladders' into your pack.	Sing some songs: your favourite ones from the radio, youtube, school or nursery rhymes. Can you learn a new song?
What can you find out about flying vehicles? For instance, hot air balloons, Zeppelins, helicopters, microlights or gliders.	Write a story with a beginning, a middle and an end.	Use your construction toys to build: a vehicle, a home for a toy, a tower or a transformer.	Draw a picture of something you can see from your window. Think carefully about the colours shapes and sizes that you can see.
Talk to your family about a journey that you have been on. Where did you start and finish? How did you get to the destination? What did you see along the way?	Practise dressing and undressing independently. Including doing up your own coat and shoes.	Help your grown up around your home. For example sorting the washing, setting the table, drying up, tidying your toys and making your bed.	Watch an episode of Caitie's amazing machines on CBeebies with your grown-up and talk about what you have found out.
