

Reception Remote Learning.

Please see below the first day of remote learning activities for your child. We recommend that these activities are spread out throughout the day and that you give your child the choice about the order they want to do them in. You could make a visual timetable together and your child can tick off or cross out the activities as they have completed them. Don't forget to include snack breaks, lunchtime and choosing their own activities times in your timetable. Doing this together will help your child understand the routine of their day, the learning expectations and as well as give your child a sense of security and control while learning at home.

Area of learning	Activity
Handwriting	<p>Warm up your hands before you start writing: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=o7U4jFsljot</p> <p>Practice drawing lines from top to bottom and back up the same line again. You can do this on one page in your 'Learning at home' book with the red cover. Practice drawing lines in the plain space at the top. Then using the printed lines, pick your favourite colours and draw vertical lines from top to bottom and back up the same line again between the printed lines.</p> <p>This handwriting practice will help you to form letters in the 'robot family': r, n, m, p, b, h and k.</p>
Phonics	<p>Sing the alphabet song: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ycnPbp_CrVg</p> <p>Using the phonics cards sent home in your learning at home pack, cut up or carefully tear them apart. Using the alphabet song to help you, put the phonics cards into alphabetical order.</p> <p>Using a pointer (this could be a stick from the garden, a spoon or your finger) teach the alphabet to a toys such as a teddy or dinosaur by pointing to each letter carefully as you sing the song.</p> <p>Muddle up the phonics cards, go through them one at a time and say the phoneme (the sound) that each letter makes. You can check how to say the phoneme by checking on the jolly phonics app or site.</p> <p>Play 'Pick a Picture' phase 2 game. Read the word and click on the correct picture. https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/2/pick-a-picture</p>
Maths	<p>Count up to 20. This song could help you: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_MVzXKfr6e8</p> <p>Using the number cards sent home in your remote learning pack, cut or carefully tear them apart. Put the number cards in order from 1-20.</p> <p>Muddle the number cards up, look at them one at a time and say aloud the number on the card.</p> <p>Practice your counting and ordering skills by playing the ladybird games on the 'Topmarks' website: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/ladybird-spots</p>
Project	<p>Our next project is all about Transport.</p> <p>Name as many types of transport as you can.</p> <p>Make a list of all the types of transport that you have every used or been on. Draw the transport and label it using your phonics knowledge to segment (sound out) the words to write them.</p>
Physical Development	<p>Cosmic Kids yoga: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=lppl_hOFI3iw</p> <p>Join Diggory the Dumptruck on his adventure.</p>
Reading	<p>Read your school reading book. Remember, once you have decoded (sounded out) the words you do not know, re-read each page to help with fluency and to understand what you have read. Talk about each page as you read.</p>
Creative	<p>Using your constructions toys such as Lego or blocks or reclaimed materials such as empty boxes, lids, straws and sticks; build a vehicle. What did you make? Which parts were easy and which parts were harder to construct? How can you improve it? What would you do differently next time?</p>
